Siovi Shuatak is a Papago name that means "sweet water." (Not Coon's Can Well, Cochibo, Cochibo Well, Cochivo, Manuels Well, Con Quien, nor Sweetwater.)

### Local usage

The recommended name is the name generally used and understood by the residents of the village. Neither of the two alternative names is sufficiently well known or liked to be in any way acceptable to them. The name "Siovi Shuatak" is duplicated on the Gila River Reservation, but the Papago village is said to be the older of the two, and its residents refused to try to find an alternative name. They suggested that the villages be called "Pimá Siovi Shuatak" and "Papago Siovi Shuatak" in order to distinguish them. (Off. Ind. Aff., 9/8/39)
