

Adopted name UzinkiMay 23, 1939

Description a village, the site of Ouzinkie postoffice, near the west end of Spruce Island in about lat. 57°55'15" N., long. 152°30" W., off the north coast of Kodiak Island, Alaska. The name is from the Russian word "Uzenki", which is the diminutive form of the adjective meaning "narrow". (Not Oozinkie, Ouzinkee, nor Ouzinkie.)
